Snow is Falling Match Game

Using music and the templates provided, here is a fun way to teach and strengthen skills to match snowflake halves with this easy to make game. Play at home or in a classroom.



To make: Using the templates from the Learning Through Music Holidays and Seasons bundle, make a snow ball out of felt. No sewing needed, just hot glue the seams leaving a large opening. Print the snowflakes on heavy paper and add Velcro to backs (or magnets or felt) and you are ready to play the game. (Laminate if you wish for durability.)

To Play: Using the MP3 track for “Snow is Falling”, play the music, instructing the children to pass the snow ball from child to child. Randomly stop the music throughout the game. Each time the music stops the child holding the snowball picks a snowflake half out of the snow ball and puts it up on the board, (magnetic, flannel, etc.). As the game continues, the children match up the snowflake halves. If you have a large group, make duplicates of the snowflakes so there are more for the children to put up. Encourage children to sing along. Also use the skill page for “Snow is Falling” which includes the lyrics of the song and have an activity for each child.
