

Whooo Can Do It!

Copy as many owls as needed on cardstock or heavy paper. Cut out and laminate or cover with clear contact paper for durability. Take a dried tree branch (not too large) and using floral oasis foam, secure it upright in a pot. Hot glue velcro dots or pieces to the tree. Hot glue a matching sized velcro dot or piece at the back of each owl near the bottom. On a sticky back note write the techniques, songs or rhythms the student or child is to demonstrate. Attach to backs of owls and attach owls to chairs, or the wall of the room with painters tape. If using with a group, have the student who chooses the owl demonstrate what is written on the back of the owl, then the class will repeat the action together. The child then secures the owl to the tree at the velcro dots.

For example:

Name a musical term and give the definition. The class repeats and uses it in a song

Sing or say a phrase of a song, then the class repeats it.

Clap the rhythm of a phrase of a designated song and have the class repeat it.

Lead part of the song, then have the class join in and lead too.

Repeat until all owls are secured on the tree or you are out of time.



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
