

Sing Up a Snow Storm

As you learn a line or phrase new song, add a snowflake to the winter clouds to create a snow storm.
Surprise the children with a snow man at the end of the snow storm!

You need:

- Heavy paper
- Magnets for each cloud if using on a magnetic board
- Yarn, heavy string or blue or white organdy ribbon,
(cut in varying lengths from 6 to 12 inches long. One for each snow flake.)
- Velcro sticky dots or Velcro and hot glue
- Laminating materials or clear contact paper- optional

To make:

- Copy clouds and snowflakes and snow man on heavy paper and cut out.
- Attach Velcro dots or pieces on the front of clouds along the bottom.
- Hot glue the end of the yarn or string to the back of snow flake as shown,
and attach the Velcro to the other end keeping the snowflake face down.
- Glue magnets on backs of clouds and snowman, (if using magnetic board for the game)
or have tape to tape them up on a wall.

To play:

- Tell the children that they are going to sing up a snow storm. They can do this by singing their best, but only the best will do. So everyone needs to be singing.
- As you teach or review a new song, each time the children sing a line well, have a child pick a stringed snowflake and have them attach the string to the cloud. Remember to remind them that they need to continue to sit up and sing well otherwise it's just a little snow flurry and not enough snow to play in. (Keep the snowman a surprise until all the snowflakes are used.) Keep playing the game until there are no more snowflakes to put up, (or you are running out of time) then tell the children to sing their best the whole song through and see what happens. At the end of the song put up the snowman and congratulate the children for singing up a snow storm.



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
